PREFACE

This publication, International Whaling Statistics No. LXXXIV, embraces the results of the Antarctic whaling during the season 1978/79.

The statistical data are based on catch reports sent to the Bureau of International Whaling Statistics, Sandefjord.

INTRODUCTION

At the 30th Annual Meeting of the International Whaling Commission in 1978 the catch limit for minke whales was set at 6,221. At the special Commission meeting in Tokyo in December 1978 the catch limit for sperm whales was set at 3,820 males and 1,055 females. The quotas set include the 1978/79 Southern Hemisphere pelagic season and the 1979 coastal season.

In addition to the above quotas the Government of Japan had granted a special permit to catch 120 Bryde's whales in the Southern Hemisphere from 13th October 1978 to 30th April 1979.

The quotas set for minke whales were sub-divided on an Area basis. The total catches to be taken in any of the Areas I to VI should not exceed the limits shown below:

Other important regulations governing the pelagic whaling in the Antarctic 1978/79 season were the following:

1. The open season for the taking of sperm whales was restricted to 8 months out of any period of twelve months.
2. The open season for the taking of minke whales was restricted to 6 consecutive months out of any period of twelve months.
3. It was forbidden to take sperm whales below 30 feet, also sperm whales over 45 feet in the Southern Hemisphere north of 40° South Latitude during the months of October to January inclusive.
4. It was forbidden to kill blue whales, fin whales, humpback whales, sei whales, Bryde's whales and suckling calves or female whales accompanied by calves.

The quotas set were split into national quotas by agreement between Japan, USSR and Brazil as follows:
